

The Spirit of Tees Valley and Paris

Climate Change is a huge problem for the world to solve, which might well take the next one hundred years to achieve. We have to embed in world culture the idea that we can and will solve the problem, by working together, using the talents of all, in the service of all, so that no future leader, for short term political reasons, is tempted to throw the world off course. The world needs a new story of hope for the future born out of the past that all can take part in creating.

The soft power tools to do the job, including symbolically named bell boats and a Paddle for Life, invented in Worcestershire, are all ready, but they need to be given to President Macron of France, who, now that President Trump is set to jump ship on the Paris Climate Change agreement, has assumed the leadership on climate change in the West.

With, steel, coal rail, boats and bridges, Tees Valley was in at the very start of the story of the Industrial Revolution. Now it can be at the very start of the story of the Climate Revolution, as we in Britain set out on a new voyage.

Alex Cunningham, Paul Williams and Andy McDonald have said that they will do all that they can to get Jeremy Corbyn to sign the Paris Paddle for Life and

Simon Clarke has said the same for Theresa May. If Mayor Ben Houchen, together with Simon Clarke can inspire Theresa May to do so then we will be well on the way to President Macron.

Stockton is where the striking match was invented by John Walker and where the coal fired steam train, Locomotion No 1, set of to help create the Industrial Revolution. All is set for Tees Valley to strike the match which starts the Climate Revolution.

Middlesbrough is twinned with Dunkirk. Tees Valley can be the lead actor in a new world story about how, as at Dunkirk, working with France, the small boats of Britain, by the narrowest of margins, saved democracy and humanity from its greatest ever threat.



The Bell Boat


The bell boat is the "main academy" a school on the water, the raft of a philosophy of all taking part and working together to tackle humanity's greatest problems, starting with climate change. It is a mobile sculpture, equally at home in an art gallery, museum, on land or on the water - spelling out its message.

It is a crew boat, but with the name of an individual, or community who has served society or civilisation, on the stern, helping to steer the world to a better future.

It is a stable, twin hulled boat, so that all can take part without fear.

The port hull bow carries the name of the crew, in this case the "Spirit of Paris". The starboard hull carries the name "Spirit of The Climate Revolution".

On the stern is the "William Penny Brookes", whose ideas lead to the Modern Olympics at Much Wedlock and Peirre de Coubertin who took them to the world after visiting Dr Brookes, when he was eighty.



The top flag on the bow flag staff represents the letter "W" and as a single flag means, "Urgent Medical Attention Needed". The lower flag represents the letter "E" and as a single flag means "Changing Course to Starboard".

The rear flag is the French flag. The centre flags are those of the European Union and the United Nations.

Thus, the signalling flags spell out the message that "WE, the crew of France, aboard the "Spirit of Paris", steered by the



"Spirit of Peirre de Coubertin and William Penny Brookes", recognising that our Home on the Blue Planet is in need of urgent medical attention, are changing course to starboard to join "The Climate Revolution" to prevent a collision, and inspiring the European Union and the trest of the nations on our planet to join us." On the top of the flagstaffs are the characters in the children's stories.

The name of the boat and the flag at the helm can be changed for any club, county, country or organisation, spelling out that everyone has a responsibility to tackle the problem. Each boat tells a story about the history of their country which, together, would create a new world story for all for the future.

The Paddle for Life



The idea of the Paddle for Life was inspired by the red lines on the floor of the House of Commons. They are two sword lengths apart and were put there when the members of parliaments wore their swords. The members were not allowed to cross the line, so as not to kill each other, if the debate became too heated. The whole British parliamentary tradition is about conflict, but we can use that history to show that out of controlled conflict we can co-operate to create a better world.

Children make a Paddle for Life from what starts out as a wooden sword and shield, symbolising conflict to co-operation. They paint the paddles with their individual designs and then get their parents and friends to sign the back and sponsor them. They plant trees to replace the wood used and keep the paddle for life, thus taking the first step in sinking carbon from the atmosphere

In any system, whether it be a club, school or country, it is essential to get whoever is at the top of the system on board. To achieve that and to start the process in any country we get a Paddle for Life signed by leaders which is used as a perpetual trophy for an event. Many leaders have signed Paddles for Life and are shown on the following pages. In terms of climate change it is vital that we get President Xi of China on board. Because of the 2,300 year old Chinese Dragon Boat Festival, if the children of China made a Paddle for Life, and planted trees, as part of the festival, the ideas could quickly reach over a billion people. With President Trump jumping ship on the Paris Climate Agreement, President Macron is now in pole position to inspire President Xi on board. With France and China on board other world leaders will follow and the ideas will sweep across the world.

The Main Voyage for Our Home on the Blue Planet



Children with their teachers and parents take part in voyages. In Worcestershire well over half the primary schools now have a day on the canals or rivers.

On 9th August 2016, a new bell boat was named by Sarah Cohen, of the Mid Worcestershire Green Party, together with her grandson Tom - in the pushchair. On the stern was the "Spirit of John McGregor and the Climate Revolution". John MacGregor, was an Anglo-Scott, who in 1865 went on a voyage around Europe, in a kayak called the Rob Roy. It led to the formation of the world's first canoe club and started the modern recreation and sport of canoeing. He later did voyages on the Baltic and the Jordan.

His paddle is used as the perpetual trophy for the British national team championships in the Olympic sport of sprint canoeing. That idea is now being used across the world.

The bell boat was named with Pershore College, "Cheerful Gold Apple Juice" which seemed very apt. Earlier the boat, together with the "Spirit of China" and the "Spirit of Germany", crewed by children, parents and teachers of "Schools and Activity Club", had taken part in the Evesham to Fladbury, "Main Voyage for Our Home on the Blue Planet".

The Main Regattas for Our Home on the Blue Planet



Children, parents, grandparents of all ages and abilities take part together in the regattas. They are a "Henley" for "all", with all taking part, rather than a few, with others watching. In Worcestershire we have fourteen regattas, the largest being the Pershore-Main Regatta for Our Home on the Blue Planet, which has over one thousand people taking part. In 2017 over four thousand five hundred children took part in both voyages and regattas. Everyone receives a certificate.

Safety and Hygiene

This is event has been organised by qualified instructors of British Canoeing.

Paddle sport on placid water is a very enjoyable and safe activity provided buoyancy aids are worn and people are aware of water hygiene.

There is now a general awareness of Weil's disease, which is a *rare* illness to which water users may be exposed. The common symptoms are:- a high temperature, influenza-like illness, joint and muscle pain-particularly in the calf muscles.

If you fall ill with the symptoms after fishing, sailing or taking part in paddle or other water sports, particularly 3-19 days following, then see your doctor and and advise her or him that you have taken part in water sports.

To prevent infection:-

Cover scratches and cuts with water proof plaster.

Wash or shower after being in or near lakes, ponds, rivers or canals, particularly before eating.

"The Main Voyage for Humanity"

On the 4th October 1957 Russia launched Sputnik into space. It led to the "Space Race" and the launch of the United States of America Apollo Programme.

In May 2015, Sir David King, Lord Nicholas Stern Lord John Browne, Lord Richard Layard, Lord Gus O'Donnell, Lord Martin Rees and Lord Adair Turner called for a Global Apollo Programme to tackle the climate change problem. It is the "Main Voyage for Humanity" - "Saving Our Home on the Blue Planet."

What we believe is that we have to learn from history and "create a creative competition", sharing our knowledge to achieve our aim, with all the nations of Earth taking part.

Here in Worcestershire we have invented the soft power tools needed to inspire every-one to take part, by using historic events from all cultures to create a new shared story for the future. They include, the bell boats, the Paddle for Life, the Main Regatta's and Voyages for Our Home on the Blue Planet and children's stories for "children of all ages".

We are now sharing the ideas with the world. The ideas are now in Russia, China, the USA, Germany, Singapore, Lithuania, Pakistan and throughout the EU and the UK. You can see more about the ideas on You Tube.





New boats will have task of spreading the message



A FORMER Olympic canoe coach from Fladbury has joined up with German friends in naming two bell boats to help spread awareness of climate change.

David Train met with Brigitte and Manfred Schäfer, the President of Coburg Canoe Club in Northern Bavaria, on Thursday, June 5 at Fladbury Paddle Club to name the boats' the 'Spirit of Germany and the Climate Revolution', to highlight how Germany and Britain must work together to tackle climate change.

"I've been friends with Brigette and Manfred for many years. In 2000 we gave two bell boats to Coburg which were named and launched by Princess Stephanie of the House of Saxe Coburg and Gotha, the House of Prince Albert and the Prince Consort of Queen Victoria," Mr Train said.

"In 2002, the boats, 'Spirit of Victoria and Albert', were used for a ten day voyage from Coburg to Frankfurt on the River Main, where more than 1,000 German rowers and canoeists relayed me, Manfred and Brigette on the

'Main Voyage for Europe and the Environment'.

We stopped on the banks of 22 German towns and cities where the mayors welcomed us and I read out a message from the Queen.

"Whilst I believe we should remain in the EU, whatever is decided by the British people on Thursday, June 23, it seems for world peace, Germany, Great Britain, the European Union and America should lead the way for the rest of the world by working together," he added.

Engineering students take stroke toward saving planet

At first, freshman Brianna Owens wasn't sure about David Train's idea of changing the world by building canoes.

But at the completion of the Purdue University freshman Engineering Project in Community Service (EPICS) course, Owens realized what Train, a former British Olympic canoe coach and former British National Canoe Champion, is trying to do.

"I started to see his vision," she said. "Preventing global warming made us want to do more as a class as a whole -

not just us — everybody." Train, the founder of Main Academy Global, is a visiting professor at Purdue from England. In England, his agency works with young children to teach them about teamwork, leadership and environmental

During the fall semester at Purdue, he brought those same concepts to 28 freshman engineering students, who partnered with Main Academy America through EPICS to build a Liberty Bell Boat. Students celebrated the completion of the boat Thursday.

A bell boat is a stable, canoe catamaran that requires cooperative paddling.

It has become part of many schools' curriculum in England to use Bell Boats as teaching tools.

It's Train's vision that the whole world start teaching children how to take care of the Earth through his program, and he believes it can only be accomplished if the United States leads the way.

He said if President George W. Bush would make this a priority, "within 15 years the world will have got on top of the problem. Without America, our (English) scientists say, humankind is dead."

Bill Oakes, associate professor of engineering, said Train

"Engineers can impact other things," Oakes explained.

"David Train definitely had a strong idea and a big goal coming in," engineering freshman Nick Landowski said.

Landowski is satisfied with the canoe the class made.

"Satisfied with actually building it, but the idea it stands for makes it more worthwhile," he said.

That idea, according to Landowski, is specifically about global warming for Train, but for him it's larger.

"It's about bringing people of the world together to unite This booklet shows for a common goal."



The "Spirit of the United States and Climate Change" was launched on Winona Lake at the Dakota Homecoming in June 2006. On the 7th November 2007, the City Manager of Winona, Eric Sorensen, signed the Paddle for Life, together with students of Winona State University.

The paddle returned to England where it was signed by Tony Blair, when Prime Minister, together with many other British leaders. The Paddle for Life was sent back to Winona in October 2007 and in November 2007 the Governor of Minnesota, Tim Pawlenty signed the paddle. Governor Pawlenty is the Chair of the Governors Association of the United States. It was later signed by Will Steger the Polar Explorer.

On 7th December 2007 students in outdoor education from Winona State University raised their large Paddle for Life on the bluffs overlooking Lake Winona and the Mississippi. They signalled to America that we have a great problem with climate change but we can solve it if we all climb on board, with our Paddle for Life. In September 2007 Winona was badly affected by floods. It will use the Winona-Main Boat Races and Regatta for the Blue Planet in 2008 as a rebirth celebration after their devastation.

It is hoped that other Governors will be inspired by Governor Pawlenty and the CommuniVersity of Winona to leap on board the "Spirit of the United States and Climate Change" and implement the "Minnesota Model'throughout the United States.





Reflections on the Olympic bell-boat relay

The Vale of Evesham School decided to mark Olympic year in a special way. There was never any doubt in my mind that bell-boating would be centre stage.

After working with many Worcestershire schools, we wanted to share an Olympic legacy with Worcestershire children and across the world, particularly in China – hosts of the 2008 Olympics.

Stoke Mandeville – birthplace of the Paralympics was the logical starting point; it is in Aylesbury, which has its own canal, a six mile arm off the Grand Union Canal.





A successful application to Get Set, the official London 2012 education programme meant we were recognised as a Plan Your 2012 School, along with only 150 others across the country.

On February 20th, The Mayor launched the head of the bell-boat fleet, The Spirit of Penglai and Sustainability. We travelled six miles and 14 locks from Aylesbury to the Grand Union Canal carrying our Mandeville Paralympic mascot, as well as Walter and Winnie the bell-boat mascots symbolising the importance of 'working together' and 'taking part'.

The next leg on 9th March saw us paddle into Birmingham, having journeyed up the Grand Union Canal to Kingswood, then along the Stratford-upon-Avon Canal to King's Norton, joining the Worcester and Birmingham Canal into Gas Street Basin. One boat now became two as The Vale was joined by a second boat paddled by children from Lickey Hills Primary School.

A week earlier, students from The Vale completed the other 'arm' of our relay - Ironbridge to Stourport, designed to include Much Wenlock, the Shropshire village where Dr Brookes planted the seed for the modern Olympic movement.

After Birmingham, the fleet increased to six bell-boats, involving schools in the locality. Sixty children from Greenfield Primary School, Stourbridge completed a stage, followed by schools from Hagley District, Kidderminster and so on.

There are too many stages to the journey to recollect them all. The journey continued right through to the end of June. Ninety Worcestershire schools, around 3,000 children and 500 adults, took part. Along the way, we held six regattas.

One of the key parts of our Get Set project was running helm courses for teachers, around 70 of whom took up the offer. This will also form part of our legacy as more schools will have the • capacity to run their own bell-boating clubs.

Our journey made China's national news websites and one of the boats involved is now been in China. Chinese children will paddle from the Eric Liddell (Chariots of Fire) Memorial Garden in Weifang to a new 'water' city site — the 'Venice' of China.

Hopefully, the messages behind the bell-boat, our Olympic legacy, will continue to spread.


